'Serial Contextualism' in Conceptual History? The Case of Self-Determination. Chair: TBA.

Abstract: There is a wide recognition among historians of political thought that the meaning of a text can only be specified by uncovering its intellectual context. This kind of contextualism was initially developed as an alternative to conceptual history. As argued by one of the main intellectual architects of the contextual approach, Quentin Skinner, 'there can be no histories of concepts; there can only be histories of their uses in argument'. Nevertheless, during the last decades, several longue durée histories, including those tracing the history of a single concept, have appeared. Skinner himself has also significantly contributed to this genre, while David Armitage has recently reminded us that such histories can still remain committed to contextualism; what is needed, is an approach of 'serial contextualism' that seeks to trace history in ideas, rather than history of ideas (or concepts). Yet what are these 'series' that we are interested in in such a long-range history? Concepts are used in arguments, but there are also argumentative patterns and conceptual schemes that seem to have a longer existence in time. What is gained and what is lost if we link these patterns to the political languages ('-isms') emerging in the nineteenth century (nationalism, liberalism, etc.) or to '-isms' seen to have originated in earlier periods (e.g., republicanism)? Are there any alternative ways of identifying the relevant 'series' in histories of concepts? The paper will explore these questions by reflecting on the ways in which long-range histories of the concept of self-determination (of peoples) could be written.
